

PRAYING ON OFFENSE

Scripture repeatedly links prayer with God's power and activity in the world—presenting prayer as the catalyst for unleashing the Kingdom. A Shepherd prays on offense with INTERCESSION (prayer for sheep) and INTENTIONALITY (fearless humility).

Prayer for Sheep Shepherds intercede by praying for others. They see prayer as a means to give God space to create opportunities for people in the organization to flourish. The role of an intercessor is to stand between God and people. The catalytic nature of prayer does not come from saying the correct words or making the right demands of God. Rather, in prayer, the Shepherd asks God what He is doing in the lives of their people and how they can join in that work. This posture of prayer opens a window to see how He is working, where He is working, and in who He is working.

Fearless Humility Shepherds respond to prayer with intentionality. The response to God's leading action is key—things discerned from the Holy Spirit must be lived out in fearless humility. The Shepherd leverages whatever God has given (gifts, power, influence, status, resources) to serve and elevate others without fear of the outcome. Praying on offense is less about wrestling some result from God and more about becoming aware of what God is doing in order to participate in it in an intentional way. Finding greatness in service to others is inherent in Jesus definition of greatness and is the pathway to unleash the Kingdom of God.

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In this guide, you will be invited to join God's work by prayer for those you shepherd. Slowly and prayerfully read through the Scripture and prayer prompts on the following pages. Write down any insight you have as you pray.

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Prayer for Your Sheep

Three times per week pray through the prompts provided. Write down any insight you have as you pray but don't feel pressure to write each time. Respond immediately if prompted to action and walk in step with His Spirit as you lead.

Prayer for Your Shepherding Space

Three times per week pray for the culture of the space that you are shepherding within. Write down any insight you have as you pray but don't feel pressure to write each time. Transforming an entire space might feel overwhelming, but walk in step with the Spirit and allow God to build his momentum in his timing. "He is faithful, and He will do it" (2 Thess. 5:24).

Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you (Matt. 7:7).

God, considering what You are showing me, what act of fearless humility can give You space to help this person become more fully who You designed them to be?

EXAMPLES TO CONSIDER:

- · Word of encouragement
- · Authentic conversation about life
- Engaging in critical conversation that I have been avoiding
- · Increased accountability for poor outcomes
- · Anonymous gesture
- · Simple act of kindness

- · Off load responsibility for over busy worker
- · Note of appreciation
- · Public praise
- · Speak truth in love
- · Release spirit of control I have over them as their leader
- · Intentional conversation about the good news of Jesus Christ
